REPORT OF THE CLERK

ANNUAL ELECTION AND DISTRICT MEETING

MAY 24 AND 25, 1994

In accordance with the foregoing notice and the by-laws of the District, the annual election of the Cotuit Fire District was held at the Fire Station, 64 High Street, Cotuit, on Tuesday, May 24, 1994, between the hours of four o'clock PM and eight o'clock PM. The results were as follows:

Also in accordance with the foregoing notice and the by-laws of the District, the annual meeting of the Cotuit Fire District was held on Wednesday, May 25, 1994, at seven-thirty o'clock PM. The meeting was called to order at 7:45. The Clerk read the call of the meeting and return of same. The results of the election were announced. Thanks were given to Mr Jack McCullough of the Prudential Committee and Mr Robert Eldred of the Fire Commissioners, both stepping down after many years of service. The following action was taken:

<u>Article 1:</u> Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to accept the reports of the officers and committees of the District as printed. (Unanimous)

- Article 2: Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to set the annual salaries of the elected officials as follows: a. Prudential Committee Members -- \$750.00; b. Members of the Board of Fire Commissioners -- \$750.00; c. Members of the Board of Water Commissioners -- \$750.00; d. Moderator -- \$150.00.
- <u>Article 3:</u> Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate \$42,000.00 for the expenses of the Financial Department. (Unanimous)
- <u>Article 4:</u> Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate \$41,537.00 for the Barnstable County Retirement assessment. (Unanimous)
- <u>Article 5:</u> Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate \$256,100.00 for notes and interest. (57 in favor and 27 opposed)
- Article 6: Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate \$11,000.00 for the maintenance and operation of Freedom Hall. (Carried)
- <u>Article 7:</u> Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate \$29,960.00 for the purpose of lighting the streets of the District. (Unanimous)
- <u>Article 8:</u> Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate \$5,500.00 for the maintenance of the Cotuit Library. (Unanimous)
- Article 9: A Moderator's ruling having been made to take up this article after the vote on Article 15, and on motion then duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate \$75,163.00 for group insurance. (Unanimous)
- Article 10: Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate \$6,808.00 for the purpose of reimbursing the Town of Barnstable for services provided by the offices of the tax collector and assessors to collect the taxes of the District. (Unanimous)
- Article 11: Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate \$319,413.46 for the labor and salaries of the Fire Department; and to raise and appropriate \$104,998.42 for the remaining expenses of the Fire Department, to be apportioned approximately as follows: a. maintenance, \$21,270.00; b. operating expenses, \$82,478.42; and c. miscellaneous, \$1,250.00; for a total appropriation of \$424,411.88. (Unanimous)

Article 12: Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to appropriate and transfer from the Ambulance Replacement Fund the sum of \$15,000.00 to purchase a portable heart monitor/defibrillator and other medical diagnostic equipment for the ambulance; and further, to authorize the Board of Fire Commissioners to dispose of certain existing medical equipment, by sale or trade, whichever is deemed to be in the best interest of the District. (Unanimous)

<u>Article 13:</u> Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate \$10,500.00 to purchase firefighting equipment for the Fire Department. (Unanimous)

Article 14: Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted that the action under this article and the following article, article 15, would be by paper ballot. Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to set a policy of having a minimum of two qualified personnel scheduled at the Fire Station twenty-four hours per day. (68 in favor, 37 opposed.)

Article 15: Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate sum of \$194,100.00 to provide additional staffing for the Fire Department so that personnel can be scheduled twenty-four hours a day. (65 in favor, 34 opposed)

Article 16: Upon motion duly made and secondeded it was voted to transfer from the ambulance account the sum of \$4,000.00 to cover the costs associated with billing for the ambulance service. (Unanimous)

Article 17: Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate: a. \$20,000.00 for the Water Department for service connections; b. \$132,205.00 for labor and salaries; \$133,000.00 for the remaining expenses of the Water and c. Department, to apportioned approximately as be follows: \$38,000.00 for maintenance; \$87,000.00 for operation; miscellaneous; for a total \$8,000.00, appropriation of \$285,205.00 and that the receipts and revenues of the Water Department be applied to these amounts. (Unanimous)

Article 18: Upon motion duly made, seconded, and amended, it was voted to appropriate and transfer from the Stabilization Fund the sum of \$200,000.00 to extend the water main system to Well #5. (Unanimous)

Article 19: Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for the continuation of the hydrant replacement program. (Unanimous)

<u>Article 20:</u> Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40,000.00 for the main extension program. (Unanimous)

Article 21: Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to raise and appropriate \$10,000.00 for the Stabilization Fund as provided under Section 5B, Chapter 40, of the General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. (Unanimous)

<u>Article 22:</u> Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to appropriate and transfer \$20,000.00 from free cash to a reserve fund. (Unanimous)

Article 23: Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to transfer \$125,000.00 from free cash in the Treasury toward the tax levy of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1994.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, it was voted to adjourn at 10:25 PM.

The Prudential Committee of the Cotuit Fire District herewith submits its annual report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

This year the Prudential Committee was faced with a very hard decision. The Fire Commissioners presented the committee with a report on the need for manning the fire station with one paramedic/firefighter and one EMT/firefighter around the clock. As a Prudential Committee who is also a finance committee that oversees the running of the district, looking at this big an expense was thought of as too big an increase for the budget. When it was looked at on a personal level, as far as the safety and well-being of our families and property, it was well worth the increase.

The Prudential Committee would like to thank our Chairman of the Water Commissioners, John Andersen, for the incredible amount of time and effort he has spent on the construction of the new pH control system for Cotuit's water system.

Freedom Hall was another issue for the Prudential Committee. The district is still faced with the problem of not being able to use the hall as a public building. It has no handicapped access nor handicapped restroom facility. The Prudential Committee is working on some options that hopefully will be brought to the residents of the village at the next district meeting.

Legislation was passed, as voted by the district, changing the offices of Clerk and Treasurer from elected offices to appointed positins. These appointments will be made by the Prudential Committee at their July, 1994, meeting.

Prudential Committee member Jack McCullough chose not to run for reelection. We would like to thank him for all he has done for the District. We also welcome Jim Gill, who has taken Mr McCullough's place on the Prudential Committee.

In closing, we would like to remind everyone that we would appreciate more involvement by you in the affairs of the District. We need you to attend meetings, run for office and VOTE. After all, it's your money. Just a few of your neighbors are voting on how much we raise and how it's spent.

PRUDENTIAL COMMITTEE

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS

TO THE CITIZENS OF THE COTUIT FIRE DISTRICT:

The Board of Fire Commissioners is pleased to submit our annual report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

At the Annual Meeting of the Cotuit Fire District, the voters approved funding for staffing the fire station twenty-four hours a day. This required the hiring of five additional Firefighter/EMTs. Because of the need for paramedic skills, we also hired three paramedics. The following were offered positions of employment and are part of the full time staff:

Scott Fenner has been a member of the call department since 1982. He has always been a mainstay in accepting duty shifts when needed. As a fire service mechanic he has specialized in the preventive maintenance and repair of emergency equipment for fire departments throughout the Cape.

Donna Parker Pierce is a paramedic and has been with the call department since 1989. She has worked full time at Cape Cod Hospital for a number of years and brings experience in emergency room and EKG techniques to the Cotuit Fire Department.

Steve Hoffman has been with the department as a call fire-fighter since 1991. Prior to that, he was a call firefighter in Norton, Massachusetts. Firefighter Hoffman has taken numerous courses in fire science at Cape Cod Community College.

Mary Jane Trainor has been a call firefighter/paramedic with the Barnstable Fire Department since 1993 and with Norfolk Bristol Ambulance prior to that. She is a graduate of Stonehill College.

Eric Littmann is a native of Newton Lower Falls, Massachusetts where he has worked as a paramedic for the Brewster Ambulance Company since 1991. He also has extensive experience as a mechanic.

The five newly hired Firefighter/EMTs and Paramedics are undergoing training in the equipment and protocols used by the Cotuit Fire Department. They are an integral part in the development of a rapid response team to provide the finest fire and rescue service to the residents of Cotuit.

BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS

Summary Of Emergency Incidents

In the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 1994, the Cotuit Fire Department responded to 404 incidents. This was approximately the same as the previous year. However, the first few months of fiscal 1995 have shown a sharp increase in incidents. Below are some tables that show incident activity and patient care as compared to the previous fiscal year:

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF WATER COMMISSIONERS

TO THE CITIZENS OF THE COTUIT FIRE DISTRICT

The Board of Water Commissioners is pleased to submit its annual report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1994.

The Cotuit Water Department is administered by a board of three water commissioners. Daily operations are maintained by the superintendant, business manager and two water system technicians. All functions are directed from the water department located at 4300 Falmouth Road. The office is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM until 12:30 PM and from 1:00 PM until 4:30 PM. After hours, emergency calls are forwarded to on-duty personnel by calling 428-2687.

Adequate water supply was provided throughout the year without interruption or curtailment of services. Water quality remained excellent. Monthly testing continued to show no presence of coliform bacteria. Testing for inorganics, volatile organic compounds, nitrates, radionuclides, secondary contaminants and lead and copper was done in accordance with the Department of Environmental Protection's regulations. All results met State and Federal requirements.

Roderick Construction Company, Inc, was awarded the contract for the installation of domestic services and emergency repairs. Thirty-one new water service connections were installed, bringing the total number of accounts to 1,814.

- D. J. Donahue Corp extended the water main eight hundred feet down Old Post Road to the District line, providing us with an additional tie with C-O-MM Water Department. They also extended the main on Popponesset Road sixteen hundred feet.
- R. E. Chapman finished the construction of the gravel-packed well, off Route 28, within the specified time frame and contracted price. This completes the first of a three-phase program to install a fifth pumping station in Cotuit. The second phase, the extension of the water main on Route 28 to the well, will be completed in FY 95.

The pH equipment installation was completed in all four stations, allowing the corrosion control system to begin full operation in June, 1994. Engineered Construction Company, Inc, finished construction on the lime-batching facility which is located behind the office building. The corrosion control system will neutralize the water, thereby eliminating the "green stains."

A new truck, equipped with a special tank and hydraulic system, was purchased to transfer the lime slurry from the lime-batching facility to the four pumping stations.

Fall River Electrical Associates Inc began the installation of the Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system in the Spring. In addition to providing automatic control and alarms for the entire water system, the SCADA installation ill store operating data and issue reports. It will be in operation by Fall.

Minor repairs were done on the Main Street tank, following an inspection by our consulting engineers, Whitman & Howard. The Main and West Street tanks are included in the water department's five-year capital program for painting and major overhaul in FY 97.

Our thanks to the residents of Cotuit for their continued support as we work diligently to provide an adequate supply of potable water. The hard work and cooperation of Superintendent Leonard Mendes and his staff is very much appreciated. Also, our thanks to the Prudential Committee, the Fire Department personnel and the Clerk/Treasurer's office for their assistance throughout the year.
